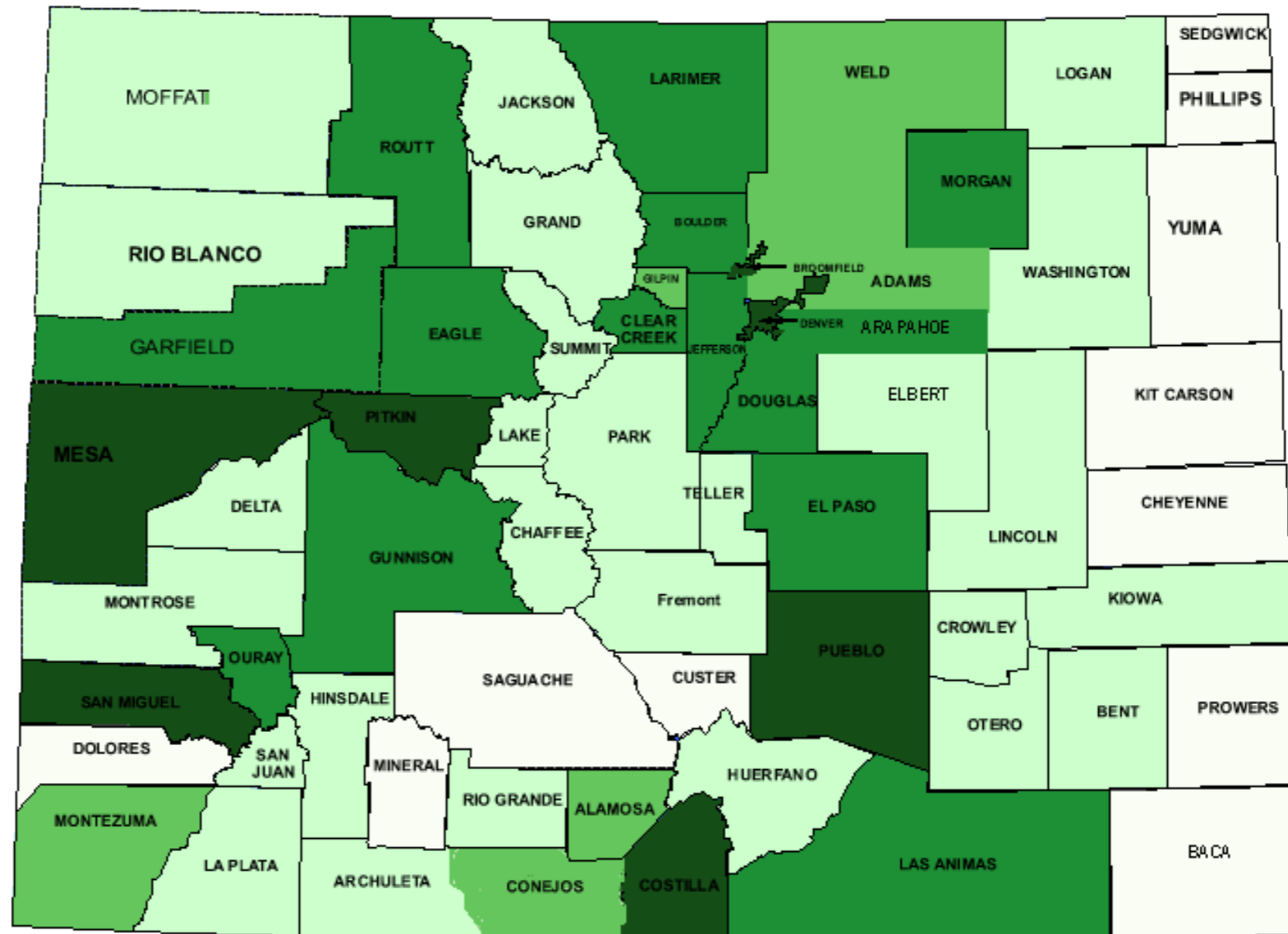

Energy Codes in CO



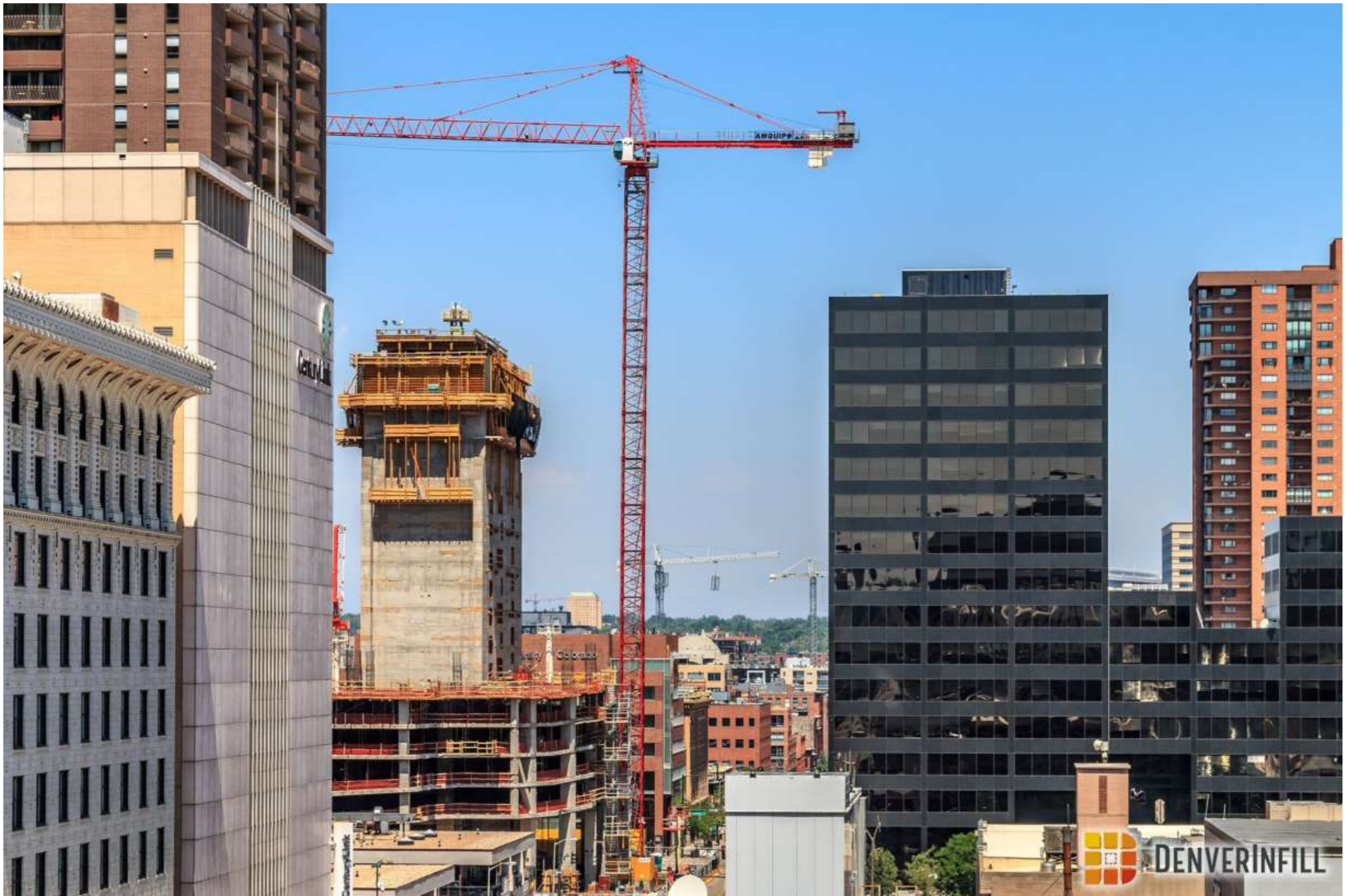
- = County and all cities within on 2012 IECC or better.
- = County on 2012 IECC or better, some cities on other than 2012.
- = County on other than 2012 IECC, some cities on 2012 or better.
- = County and cities on other than 2012, Factory Built Program on 2012 or better (after 1/1/2013).
- = County and cities on no energy code. Factory Built Program on 2012 or better (after 1/1/2013).



Commercial Code Compliance Study

- Develop top 10 - 15 checklist for inspectors
- Focus on “lost energy savings” rather than % compliance
- How much money and energy can be saved if a commercial building complies with energy code?
